Understanding Military Discharge Characterizations and Your VA Benefit Eligibility

Overview:
Your discharge status plays a critical role in determining your eligibility for VA benefits. Many veterans with
less-than-honorable discharges still qualify for select benefits-or may be eligible for a discharge upgrade or
Character of Discharge (COD) review.

DISCHARGE TYPES & DEFINITIONS
1. HONORABLE
- Fully eligible for all VA benefits (health care, disability, education, home loan, burial, etc.)
- Indicates exemplary military service
2. GENERAL (UNDER HONORABLE CONDITIONS)
- Eligible for most VA benefits:
[Yes] Health care
[Yes] Disability compensation

- May qualify through a **Character of Discharge (COD) review** or **discharge upgrade**
- Still potentially eligible for:

[Yes] VA health care for service-connected conditions

[Yes] Mental health services (especially for combat PTSD/MST)

[Yes] Some state veteran benefits

4. BAD CONDUCT

- Issued by a court-martial (not administrative)
- Generally not eligible for VA benefits
- Requires a successful COD review or discharge upgrade

5. DISHONORABLE

- Issued for serious crimes via court-martial
- [No] Ineligible for VA benefits

DISCHARGE UPGRADE PATHS



You may request a **Discharge Upgrade** or **Character of Discharge Review** if:

- You have PTSD, TBI, or MST that contributed to your misconduct
- You received your discharge more than 15 years ago but believe it was unjust
- Your discharge was related to race, sexuality, or discrimination

HOW TO APPLY FOR AN UPGRADE:

- Submit VA Form **DD-293** (if within 15 years of discharge)
- Submit VA Form **DD-149** (if over 15 years ago)
- File with the appropriate military discharge review board (DRB or BCMR)

DOCUMENTS TO INCLUDE:

[Yes] Medical or VA mental health records

[Yes] Personal statement describing the event(s)

[Yes] Character references or counselor letters

[Yes] Disciplinary history or court-martial records (if applicable)

CHARACTER OF DISCHARGE REVIEW (VA)

Even if the military doesn't upgrade your discharge, the **VA** can still grant benefits through a **COD review** if:

- You served honorably during a specific period



NEED HELP?

- Your offense was minor or linked to mental health conditions
- You fulfilled the obligation despite the discharge

HOW TO REQUEST A COD REVIEW:
- Submit your **VA claim** (e.g., Form 21-526EZ)
- VA will automatically begin a Character of Discharge review
- You may submit additional evidence supporting honorable service
SUMMARY CHART
Discharge Type
Honorable [Full Access] Full access
General (Honorable) [Full Access] Most benefits, [No] GI Bill
Other Than Honorable [Restricted] Most denied unless COD/upgrade approved
Bad Conduct [No] Ineligible, unless upgraded
Dishonorable [No] Ineligible
